Resolved: Which is the superior system—Capitalism or Socialism.



## **IDEA GENERATOR**

#### Pros

- The right to own property is central to man's existence. Private ownership of property gives individuals security and a means to control their own affairs.
- In capitalism, the market determines price, including pay the price of labour.
- Socialism cannot protect human rights because it seeks the good of "the people" in the abstract.

#### Cons

- The wealth of the earth belongs to all men or to none. Under capitalism, property is concentrated into the hands of relatively few well-off people, leaving the many with nothing and at the mercy of the rich for work, charity, etc. This leads to gross inequality, exploitation and misery.
- Wealth is concentrated in the hands of the few. The rich get richer, the poor get poorer.
- Economies in capitalist systems are essentially unplanned, so they often crash, producing depressions that damage the lives of millions.

### See for example:

Person A: "In my opinion, I believe Capitalism is superior to Socialism since Capitalism gives power to individuals without being overpowered by the government. Freedom is therefore absolute for people to earn profit for themselves."

Person B: "I strongly stand that Socialism is superior since there is equal distribution of society's goods to be achieved by the government. Everything is for the benefit of the whole economy, not just the rich.
